T-Shirt Reprinting. Julie experimented with printing them on the front and machine embroidering them on the sleeve, but is not satisfied with the results. Although we originally were charging \$10 for the shirts, Katt thinks we should up the price to \$15, since they are long-sleeved. We will honor the \$10 price for people who have already paid. Susan L. can do the screen printing on the front and will digitize the logo to embroider on the sleeve. M/2 we turn the project over to Susan, who will return the shirts completed for \$3.25 apiece, which will allow us to sell them at a profit. M/C.

Other Business:

BRCG Letterhead for Stationery and other Official Documents. Katt will ask Kier and Randolph if they could create a letterhead for us. Susan L. would like us to revive our custom of providing membership cards, because, among other things, that will get us 10% off at Hancock Fabrics. The meeting adjourned at 8:30, followed by a spectacular show and tell from Vicki, and another of our traditional post-meeting potlatch of fabrics, outfits, trinkets, and other desirables.
